Hidden in the walls of the digestive system, this "brain in your gut" is revolutionizing medicine's understanding of the links between digestion, mood, health and even the way you think. Scientists call this little brain the enteric nervous system (ENS). And it's not so little. The ENS is two thin layers of more than 100 million nerve cells lining your gastrointestinal tract from esophagus to rectum.

Digested food from the stomach is pumped into the small intestine, which gets flooded with fluid and enzymes from the liver (bile) and the pancreas (pancreatic amylase, trypsin, and lipase). Those chemicals help to break the molecules from the digesting food into its smallest components.

How Long Does It Take to Digest Food?

The liver receives blood from the gut, filters it, removes toxins, metabolises drugs, stores nutrients and synthesises proteins for various purposes including blood clotting. It also synthesises bile. The gall bladder stores and concentrates bile, and after a meal squeezes it into the small intestine, where it helps to digest fat.

Between the stomach and the intestine, ducts enter the digestive tube from the liver and pancreas. The liver is a large, clearly defined organ. The pancreas may be embedded in it, diffused through it, or broken into small parts spread along some of the intestine. The junction between the stomach and the intestine is marked by a muscular valve.

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
